
OPEN RECORDS ACT AGGRESSIVE REVISION ATTEMPT

Remove reasonable standard for compliance 5-day deadline, limited exceptions

Remove requirement for requests in writing oral requests authorized

Remove reasonable penalties

\$75/day penalty from date should have released applies to "custodian of funds"


